

Message from Rabbi Jay M. Stein





yahrzeit we observe this month, addressed the Biennial meeting of JTSA and said,

"In the days of yore, when Babylon formed the centre of Jewish civilization, and the eyes of the whole of Israel were turned toward the banks of the Euphrates and the Tigris for instruction and enlightenment, they had the goodly custom to meet twice a year in religious convention; once at the end of the winter, and again at the end of the summer. These conventions, which usually met at the great seats of learning, Sura and Pumbedita, were honored with the presence of the heads of the Academies, the chiefs of the Colleges, the Princes of the Captivity, and the Judges of the Gate. These men of light and leading, they and their disciples, and the disciples of their disciples, all flocked there with the purpose of fighting out the "Battle of the Torah," until every obscurity was made clear, and every law was fixed, citing proof from the Bible, the Mishnah, and the removing Talmud, thus stumbling block from the path of Israel. The session extended over a

whole month, and the days on which they met were called the "Days of the Kallah.

But times have changed and we have changed with the times. We have grown too old and too sober for semi-annual honeymoons. Life is too strenuous, and the demands upon the time of our communal workers are too great to allow any hope of such protracted meetings of a month's duration..."

- March 20, 1904

It is in this vein that I bring to your attention a similar event that takes place today in our community. UNITED SYNAGOGUE OF CONSERVATIVE JUDAISM INTERNATIONAL BIENNIAL CONVENTION – December 6-10, 2009 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Cherry Hill, New Jersey!

The theme of the convention is: What is a Jewish community? How do we build one? How do we maintain it?

How do we raise the funds for it? How do we welcome anyone? How do we relate to Israel? How do we relate to one another? What works for other congregations? What works for us? How do we find our leaders? How do we encourage our members? How does the Conservative Movement understand, live with, and reshape Jewish law? How do music, meditation, and storytelling enrich our prayer experience? How do we reinvigorate the Movement?

These are some of the questions that occur to committed Conservative Jews, and they are some of the questions that will be addressed, debated, and maybe even answered at the Biennial Convention. Join us as we also celebrate our Solomon Schechter Award winners. Registration and detailed information is available at http://www.uscj.org/International_Bienni7052.html.

As you may realize, a meeting of the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards (CJLS) will take place during this Convention, and I invite you to attend. It is open to all. It is a rare opportunity to see the CJLS in action. This is the place where Jewish law is debated and formulated among the leading scholars of our Movement. It is where Jewish law is most alive for our Movement and you can witness it firsthand. And it is incredibly exciting.

We are all incredibly busy. The demands on our schedule are sometimes overwhelming. And it is precisely in these times that we need to make sure to recharge our battery. As Solomon Schechter aptly pointed out 95 years ago, each of us needs a "spiritual honeymoon." We need to come together with other likeminded people to talk about what is really important to us and how we sustain it. We need to gain strength from one another through fellowship and friendship. We need to be supported by toiling in the field of ideas and learning. And this is such an event. Attending the Biennial Convention of United Synagogue will do for you what Sabato Morias felt the Biennial Meeting of 1904 did for Rabbis. It "will nurture and raise spiritual physician, Rabbis skilled in the art of infusing into our religious body fresher and more vigorous powers."

Following last month's Choral Arts Celebration featuring the Fargenign Chorus, HAZAAC continues its year-long Celebration of The Arts and Jews and/or Jews and The Arts with A Celebration of The Literary Arts and The Lincoln Bicentennial. On Wednesday, November 11, Rabbi Jay Stein & Missy Stein will discuss and review Dara Horn's novel, "All Other Nights."

This historical novel about Jews in the Civil War is based on actual facts and events such as the burning of Richmond, and on real personalities such as Judah Benjamin, the Jewish Secretary of State of the Confederacy. "All Other Nights" is a tale of adventure that weaves the Jews of the North and the South together in a web of love, dignity and loss that drives men and women to the limits of loyalty and betrayal. It is also a parable of the lingering rift in America between those who value family and tradition first, and those dedicated, at any cost, to social and racial justice for all.

Rabbi Stein's review of Ariel Sabar's "My Father's Paradise," a highlight of HAZAAC's programs last year, was extremely informative and entertaining. His book review this year, with Missy joining him in the review and discussion of "All Other Nights," promises to be doubly so.

Har Zion Men's Club We've Got It Covered

In over 20 years of being a member of our beloved Shul, two experiences stand out. The first happened on the second day of Rosh Hashanah 5768-2007. My father of blessed memory had passed away a week and a half before the preceding Pesah. We hosted a dinner the second night

where everyone except me was having a joyous time. The only part I enjoyed was the brisket. I was still upset when I entered the Sanctuary the next morning. Upon entering I realized that I missed my father the night before. What was amazing to me is that for the first time since he had passed I missed him for the healthy and vibrant man I loved, not the sickly man he was for the last three years of his life. My recollection of him since has been the wonderful full of life man he was. In addition to this being the critical moment in my healing, I also believe it was a message from God that my father had merited Paradise in The World to Come.

The second experience involves my wife and soul mate, Gail. In February 2004, I received a phone call from Gail saying they found a lump in the back of her breast that was malignant. For three-four weeks we were on edge until it was discovered the cancer had not spread and was caught early. She has been cancer-free since, Baruch Hashem. A few days after the phone call (before I was to learn all would be OK) I went to my usual Friday morning minyan. Out of nowhere my body felt a warm soothing feeling. At the time I thought it was a message to me that no matter what happened to Gail I would be able to find strength and comfort praying at Har Zion.

While Har Zion is a large synagogue, as I can testify it is a place where one's Judaism can be fulfilled many times. A great Jewish saying is "life is with people." I have always loved feeling empathy for my fellow congregants. During every Mourners' Kaddish I pray for all those saying yahrzeit or in mourning that they will have the strength to get through this time. I ask God to take all those souls taken from this world to be cared for by God. On a happier note, I love to sing with joy Mazel Tov for every simha we celebrate as a community. When you wish someone well, it is a prayer. When congregants rise for someone sick, I pray for them and their loved one who is sick. After over 20 years and two amazing experiences described above, I have found it works.

A great way to feel a connection is to come to Friday morning minyan or a Men's Club meeting. The Men's Club sponsors breakfasts and an always-inspiring teaching by Rabbi Stein. Our Men's Club meetings on the first Thursday of the month in the evening always include a meaningful D'var Torah by either Rabbi Rozenwasser or Rabbi Alpert. Both are great ways to start the last day of the work week and prepare for Shabbos.

May you and your loved ones find inspiration and strength now and always in our beloved Shul.

Journey From The Land of No by Roya Hakakian Hakakian recounts her past as a girl growing up in the second largest Jewish community in the Middle East -Tehran - during the takeover of the Ayatollah Khomeini. She paints pictures of a changing Iran, from a land that was immersed in the poetry of life and discovery to one that spoke of militaristic prayer and repression, where Jewish people were once again subject to anti-Semitism, and where women were stripped of many of their rights. Hakakian's story is that of an individual changing from innocent child into disillusioned, rebellious teenager.

IN THE SCHOOL...

"Thanksgiving"

Message from Rabbi Nogah Marshall, Educational Director

Last year for the first time in my life I did not spend Thanksgiving Day with my family in Syracuse, New York. My family, somewhat large (five children) is spread out throughout the United States and Europe, and with three rabbis in the family it is often



rare to have the entire family together at one time especially during the Jewish holidays. So last year, as I picked up the phone to call my mother to share with her the news that I would not be joining the family for Thanksgiving Day, the response I received was somewhat unexpected. My mother, I quote, said, "So, I will make Thanksgiving Dinner when you do come home over the weekend." That evening I thought about what my Mother had said and came to the realization that it is possible to have Thanksgiving dinner any and every night of the year.

In just a matter of weeks, America will be celebrating the national holiday of Thanksgiving, a holiday that many of us view as a religious one – possibly a holiday almost of equal importance to Yom Kippur, Passover, and Hanukkah. We all know the origin of Thanksgiving; a national holiday in the United States commemorating the harvest reaped by the Plymouth Colony in 1621 after a winter of starvation.

And so I ask you, why is it necessary to establish one specific day of the year to celebrate as a day of Thanksgiving? Are we too self-absorbed in our everyday lives that we actually need to schedule in our calendars a day to be thankful for what we have in our lives? Does this day infer that we do not need to be thankful every other day of the year?

Every day in all of our schools beginning with our youngest children we teach about appreciation and thanking God for all of the wonderful things we have been given. We teach our children that in Judaism every day of our lives is a day of thanksgiving. Our students from preschool to Midrasha learn that in the morning when we wake up we recite Modeh Ani Lefanecha Melech Chai Vekayam, Shehechazarta Bi Nishmati Bechemla Rabah Emunatecha, I am grateful to You, living, enduring Kind, for restoring my soul to me in compassion. You are faithful beyond measure. We also teach our students to recite the morning blessings thanking God for many things such as allowing us to distinguish between night and day and allowing us to open up our eyes. They learn that every day we Jews are expected to recite one hundred blessings giving thanks to God for everything that we do, from the



food we have been granted to seeing something for the very first time. For over two thousand years the Jewish people have celebrated Thanksgiving every day.

So this Thanksgiving as you gather with friends and family, I urge you to take a moment at dinner to truly reflect upon what you are thankful for and recite the *Shehechiyanu*, the blessing that acknowledges God for allowing us to reach this point in our lives. And when Thanksgiving Day is over I urge you to not wait until the next Thanksgiving to reflect upon what you are thankful for. Rather, I urge you to try to incorporate ways within your children to be thankful every day, by reciting the *Shehechiyanu* upon eating a new fruit, reciting the blessing before and after you eat, or even just saying the words thank you to one another.

As it says in Psalm 92: Tov L'hodot Ladonai Ulizamer Leshimcha Elyon. "It is good to acclaim Adonai, to sing Your praise, exalted God." Let's follow these words and give thanks every day of our lives.






